The Portager editor Ben Wolford promotes student media stories in his newsletter. In turn, KSU continues to recommend students for Wolford to work alongside. Additionally, the other outlets already have high viewership. This allows student work to automatically be seen by the viewers of the particular news outlets.

Impacts

Students write about three stories per semester that are published with the partner organizations, reaching a viewership of more than one million readers.

Student work

Recently, the NewsLab has hired a part-time editor named Rosalie Murphy to help with student work. Additionally, Ben Wolford, a former student editor of Professor Zake, aids in editing stories for The Portager. Finally, Zake and Marino are large parts of the program, as they help to edit and revise student work.

Most students receive around \$1500 per semester for their involvement in the program, some students also elect to receive credit instead.

Faculty/staff

The faculty and staff involved in the program are responsible for managing the NewsLab and the partnerships. Additionally, they assist in the editing of the stories to varying degrees depending on the needs and resources of the partners.
