#### Student Work

Students in the Jandoli School of Communication at St. Bonaventure University do almost all the reporting for TAPinto Greater Olean, writing advance stories about upcoming events, covering news and sports as they happen, and providing commentary. TAPinto Greater Olean's staffers per semester are as many as 15 and as few as 5 in enrollees in the undergraduate, experiential learning Journalists' Workshop two-semester course, earning 3 credits each semester. Other Jandoli School majors earn internship hours by contributing stories. And graduate students in the Lees' Writing and Editing course also write a story a piece.

### Faculty/staff

Richard Lee, a full professor, and Anne Lee, a lecturer, team-teach the experiential reporting undergraduate class as well as the graduate writing and reporting course. Both Lees have newspaper and government communication experience.

### Funding sources

The Jandoli School of Communication pays the franchise fee for TAPinto Greater Olean. The franchise currently is utilized as a journalism practicum for the students, but plans are underway to develop a business side like all other TAPinto franchises have.
