


## 2018 Vermont Population Brief

- Vermont's population increased by 0.3% between the 2006-2010 and 2012-2016 time periods.
- Population increased in all regions and the U.S., overall.
- The Southern region of the U.S. had the largest percentage increase of 6.9% while the Midwest had the lowest at 1.7%.
- Among U.S. states, Vermont had the fifth lowest population change after Michigan & Rhode Island (both experienced pop decreases), Maine & West Virginia.


The Vermont State Data Center, funded through the Agency of Commerce and Community Development:

- Vermont's population grew by 1,991 or 0.3% between the two ACS time periods.
- Between the same time periods, population decreased in ten counties and increased in four.
- The county with the greatest percent increase in population was Lamoille County with 4.6%, or 1,096 additional residents.
- The county with the greatest absolute change was Chittenden County with an increase of 5,781 people, or 3.7%.
- Rutland County
  experienced the
  greatest percentage and
  absolute population
  loss, with a 3.4%
  decrease, representing
  a loss of 2,145
  residents.

These data provide estimates of population change between Decennial Census years using two independent ACS 5-year estimate periods.
