RESUME

The purpose of the resume is to communicate your education, skills, technical skills, and qualifications for a specific role. Make sure you are tailoring it as you apply!

COVER LETTER

Beyond the resume, highlight and expand upon your skills and qualifications to prove why you are a great match and fit for the position you are applying to.

NETWORKING

Networking is an essential part of professional

development and growth. It can help you learn about

what type of industry you want to be part of, what

it's like to work for a specific company, and even give

you insight into a "hidden" job market.

PRO TIP:

An average of 85% of individuals say they found their internships or jobs through their network. Make sure to leverage your family, friends, faculty/staff, and other mentors while conducting your job search!
