Suresh V. Garimella, President of the University of Vermont and Professor of Mechanical Engineering Commencement Remarks (as prepared) – Sunday, May 21, 2023

Good morning! And what a glorious morning it is!

It is <u>my great honor</u> to preside over the University of Vermont's 222nd Commencement celebration.

And we are proud to recognize the years of commitment, perseverance, and hard work invested by those of you graduating today to reach this milestone.

Just a few days ago, I had the experience of watching our son graduate from college. I know very well the feeling of pride that parents, families, mentors and friends share at these occasions.

And so, before I proceed, let me take a moment to recognize those here with us who supported you throughout your UVM journey. Would all of the <u>parents</u>, <u>grandparents</u>, <u>siblings</u>, <u>spouses</u>, <u>families</u> <u>and loved</u> <u>ones</u> please stand so we may express our sincere thanks? ... <u>Thank you</u>, on behalf of the UVM community and on behalf of everyone graduating today—our students couldn't have done this without YOU. Well done, families and friends!

I hope the pride all of us gathered to celebrate today feel in you only <u>begins</u> to reflect the pride you feel in yourselves. Every bit of applause, every congratulatory word and embrace, every moment of recognition is truly yours. Soak it in and enjoy it. You've certainly earned it.

Today is a culmination, not a conclusion. It is also not really a beginning, even if that is the most common definition of the word commencement. In reality, the journey of learning and discovery neither begins nor ends here. These are lifelong pursuits for all of us.

We carry into each new stage of that journey the experiences we've accrued and the perspectives we've gained, ... and we build upon them. 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All that you have learned and accomplished at UVM has propelled you to this point and will carry you beyond it. Whether continuing academic excellence in graduate studies or embarking on the first steps in a successful professional career, each of you has a compelling story ahead – and the skills and tools to live it with confidence.
