The Department of Sociology offers an optional 12 credit concentration in *Social Gerontology* including SOC 020 and SOC 120; either SOC 220 or SOC 222; and at least one course from SOC 154, SOC 254, or SOC 255.

The Department of Sociology offers an optional 12 credit concentration in *Crime & Criminal Justice*, including SOC 014, SOC 112, SOC 115, SOC 216, or SOC 258. Special or variable topics/courses and internships as approved by the concentration advisor. At least 6 credits must be at 100 level or above, at least 3 credits must be at the 200 level.

Students interested in completing the Social Gerontology or Criminal Justice concentrations are encouraged to consult their faculty advisor early in their program.
