| 22                        | Organized Research<br>(Chart Field Functions:<br>311,312,313,320)               | <ul> <li>Organized Research includes all research and development activities of an institution that are separately budgeted and accounted for on a specific project. This category includes:         <ul> <li>Sponsored Organized Research: Research projects sponsored through grants, contracts and cooperative agreements. (function 311)</li> <li>University Organized Research: Projects funded by University funds (function 320)</li> <li>Sponsored Research Training: Training of individuals in research techniques. Common examples are Career Development ("K") awards, institutional training grants (T32) and individual fellowships (F32). | 24                        | VCHIP Program Space<br>(Chart field Program<br>0601)                            | VCHIP program space includes all space that has activity funded by VCHIP, chartstrings with a program code of 0601 represents VCHIP funding. All functions of VCHIP activity are considered VCHIP space and should be coded only 24.   |
| 28                        | Experiment Station Research (Chart field functions: 351, 352 & 353)             | Experiment Station Research includes primarily field experiments activities that are separately budgeted and accounted for on a specific project. The Hatch research activities in the College of Agriculture and the McIntire-Stennis forestry activities within the Rubenstein School Environment and Natural Resources are examples of experiment station research.  • Sponsored Experiment Station Research: projects sponsored through grants, contracts and cooperative agreements. (function 351)  • Experiment Station Research Cost Sharing: Cost sharing on experiment station research projects including matching, voluntary committed cost sharing and salary cap cost sharing on federal formula grants (functions 352, 353)   |

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| 30 | Public Service (Chart field functions: 401,411,412,413)                                   | Public Service provides to the general public the benefits of the instructional and/or research activities of the University. Conferences and institutes conducted through PACE are included in this category.  |

| 38 | Extension Research<br>and Extension Service<br>(Chart field functions<br>361,362,421,422) | Extension research activities are extension projects such as SARE that primarily support basic, applied or experimental/developmental activities (sponsored function code = 361, Cost Share function code = 362).   |

| 50 | General Administration<br>(Chart field function<br>515, 521, 541, 542)                    | General Administration includes the orderly planning and operating of the University in terms of academic affairs, fiscal affairs, personnel, administrative support, and public relations.   |
| 52 | Facilities Admin (Chart field function is 601 or 602 and property =                       | Facilities Administrative includes services related to the administration, supervision, operation, maintenance, preservation, and protection of campus facilities. Services include:  |

| 55 | Museum  | Museum includes all space and support service space housing collections open to the public of artistic, technical, scientific, historical, or archaeological material, excluding libraries.   |

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| 56 | Departmental<br>Administration (Chart<br>field functions: 501,<br>502, 505, 509, 519) | Departmental Administration includes all administrative activities by the academic departments to support the primary programs of instruction, research and public service. Academic offices such as Deans' and Directors' offices are included in this space function.   |

| 57 | Environmental Safety  | Environmental safety space includes the Environmental Health Facility and the space used by the University's Environmental Safety staff to carry out activities such as managing hazardous waste disposal, coordinating the University's biosafety program, lab safety training and environmental compliance.   |
| 58 | Sponsored Project Administration (Chart field function 531)                           | Sponsored Projects Administration is limited to separate organizational units to administer sponsored agreements. Sponsored Project Administration and Financial & Cost Accounting Services are the organizational units in this space function.  |
| 59 | Research Protection<br>Office   | Space allocated to the Research Protection Office is assigned this unique code which is reserved for the Research Protection Office only.   |
| 60 | Auxiliary Services (Fund 150 Chart field)   | Auxiliary Services includes space attributed to such income/expense activities as Residential Facilities, University Store, Print and Mail Center, Instrumentation and Model Facility, Animal Care Facility and Athletics.  |
| 70 | Lease/License to Third Parties  | Non-institutional use of space leased to a third party pursuant to a lease agreement, including those that generate little or no rental income.   |
| 71 | Food Service  | Non-institutional use of space used in conjunction with outsourced food service function operated by third-party food service provider under management agreement. Includes any operations managed by food service provider pursuant to the food service management contract.   |
| 72 | Non-Institutional Agencies (without lease agreement or function code 999)             | A non-institutional agency occupying UVM space without a lease agreement. Occupants of UVM space who are non-UVM paid such as University of Vermont Medical Center employees, non-UVM paid faculty emeriti or visiting professors are examples where this space code should be used. Includes agreements with a third-party for the use of research facilities and/or equipment for less than one year. |
| 73 | Management<br>Agreement   | Non-institutional use of space occupied by third-party agent operating on behalf of the University. Potential examples may include privatized parking operations or bookstore, pursuant to a management agreement.  |
| 74 | Vending/ATM<br>Machines   | Non-institutional use of space occupied by third-party's vending machine, ATM machine, public telephone, etc.   |
| 75 | University Foundation   | Space used in support of the UVM Foundation.  |
| 81 | Inactive  | Inactive space includes space that is vacant for the entire fiscal year. If space is used for part of the year, assign the functions according to how it was used when occupied.  |
| 82 | Alteration  | Renovations of space which occurred during the entire fiscal year. If space is used for part of the year, assign the functions according to how it was used when occupied.  |
