I. Welcome and Introductions

II. News and Updates

- A. Deb Heleba started an advisory committee last year, comprised of two members from each EMG chapter. We need one volunteer to attend some of the online meetings, with Peg or in her place if she can't make it. The meetings are a good way for the chapters to connect with each other and share ideas, are a good way to get to know people in different parts of the state, and count for volunteer hours.
- B. Cindy Heath's film series continues this Friday 2/24 at 9am. The film is "Beatrix Farrand's American Landscapes" followed by a discussion with Lynden B. Miller, who wrote the book "Parks, Plants, and People: Beautifying the Urban Landscape". The previous film "My Garden of a Thousand Bees" is still available online for viewing. The next film, on Friday, March 3rd at 9am, is Portrait of a Garden, a documentary about two long time friends caring for a garden on a Dutch estate.
- C. This Wednesday 2/22 at 12pm is the UVM Webinar "Winter Peas as Dual-Use Crops". This counts towards EMG educational credits. It will be available to view after the 22nd as well.
- D. Deb Heleba is working on a jumping worm program for March or April with Josef Gorres.
- E. We will have an Ask a Master Gardener table at the Windham Conservation Plant Sale on Saturday 5/6 at Green Mountain Orchards in Putney.
- F. Bob Little Tree is discussing invasive pests at the Vermont Flower Show at the Champlain Valley Exposition in Essex which runs from Friday 3/3- Sunday 3/5.

- C. In the past, we paired with In the Garden Greenhouses in Claremont, NH to sell hanging baskets and we split the proceeds with them 50-50.
- D. There was discussion about including and reaching out to current EMG students to volunteer at the plant sale.
- E. Peg is working on an April workshop, possibly with Henry Homeyer, at the Howard Dean Educational Center in Springfield to help us prepare pots for the plant sale. This is tentatively scheduled for Saturday 4/15, 9am-1pm. Peg will ask Gardener's Supply to donate soil and seeds.
