

DONNA COVAIS, Class of 2003 - LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD PROFILE

Donna Covais is a certified Horticultural Therapist who ran her own florist's shop before completing the Extension Master Gardener's program in 2003. We are fortunate that she combined her skills and experience to develop a UVM EMG horticultural therapy project that serves seniors with memory loss and other special needs. For over a decade Donna has led this project with a team of dedicated EMGs at an adult day care program located in South Burlington that is run by UVM Health Network-Home & Hospice (formerly the VNA).

Every month before the pandemic Donna and her team provided horticultural therapy sessions to clients by engaging their senses in the creation of floral arrangements, wreaths, cornucopias and other horticultural delights for the participants to take home to their caretakers and loved ones. Each month's activities centered around a seasonal theme, such as St. Patrick's Day, Mother's Day, the 4th of July, etc. Donna skillfully led her team to engage clients' senses and she had a great talent for bringing out memories, stories, jokes and even songs from her participants.

The project's scope also includes managing a "Secret Garden" enclosed by walls and attached to the adult day care center. This allows clients to safely explore the outdoors – to see, smell and touch the flowers and taste the herbs and vegetables that the EMG team grows. The garden's produce is incorporated into on-site lunches and snacks – contributing *very* local organic ingredients to clients' meals. One of the highlights of the year is the summer garden party, where clients, staff and the EMG team gather to share a lunch in the garden.

Donna also brought the American Horticultural Therapy Association (AHTA) to Burlington for their annual convention in 2017. Donna and Charlie Nardozzi shared the stage as keynote speakers.

She received her Lifetime Achievement Gold Badge and Certificate in 2017. I had the pleasure of supporting Donna with organizing her annual Boxwood Tree Workshop she held at the UVM Horticultural Research Farm for several years, and enjoyed the one year that I attended and created my own boxwood tree. It was a lot of fun, and I enjoyed that tree on my dining room table for several months following the holidays. Sadly, we just learned that Donna passed away on December 7^{th,} 2021. She will be missed dearly by the EMG program. Our thoughts and prayers are with Donna's husband, family & friends.
