# **Committee Reports**

- Compensation and Benefits Committee (by Baxter Worthing)
  - Presented slides that were presented to graduate faculty last week.
  - Outlined the progress on fees and recommendations from the Compensation and Benefits Committee.
  - The administration should continue to decrease comprehensive fees by \$50 per year until it reaches \$1000/year.
  - Presented recommendations on tuition and international student support: For students in unfunded
    professional doctoral programs, ensure tuition frozen for the duration of their time in the program,
    continue exploring variable tuition rates to reduce costs for programs without funding for students,
    and explore resources available to international students and build a database of opportunities.

- Presented recommendations for stipends such as increasing minimum doctoral stipend to that
  outlined Vermont Basic Needs Budget and Livable Wage document, increase master's stipends in an
  equitable manner compared to increase in doctoral stipends and encourage more applications for
  individuals and university training grants and other means to secure stipends for unfunded students
  in eligible doctoral programs.
- Talked in detail about the "Vermont Basic Needs Budget and Livable Wage". It is a market-based analysis that accounts for estimated monthly living expenses in Vermont. - Presented comments on the data presented by Dean Forehand. According to Baxter's analysis
  (based on Vermont Basic Needs Budget and Livable Wage), Graduate Students should earn \$36,308
  a year as a living wage if not sharing a room. If sharing, then this number goes down to \$29,658 as
  the rent goes down.
