



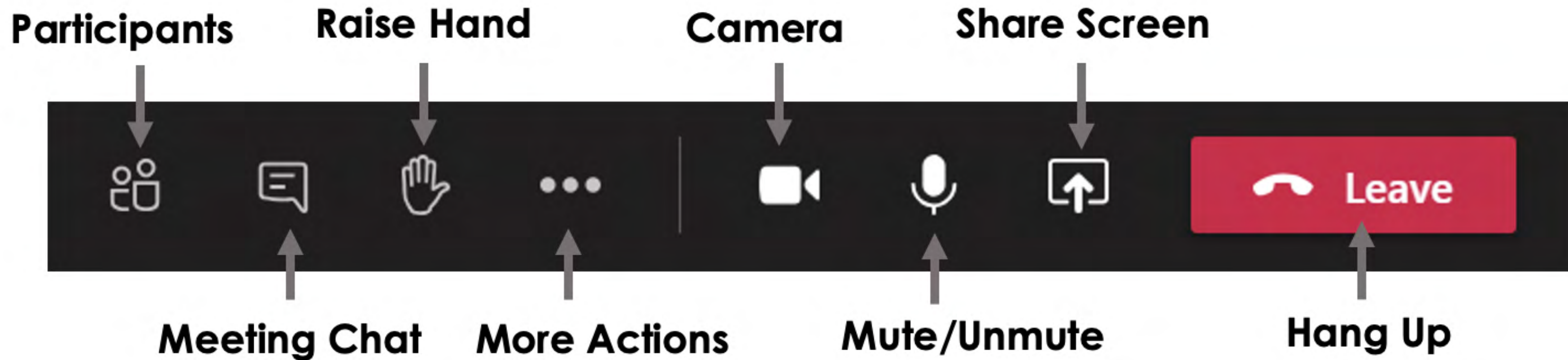

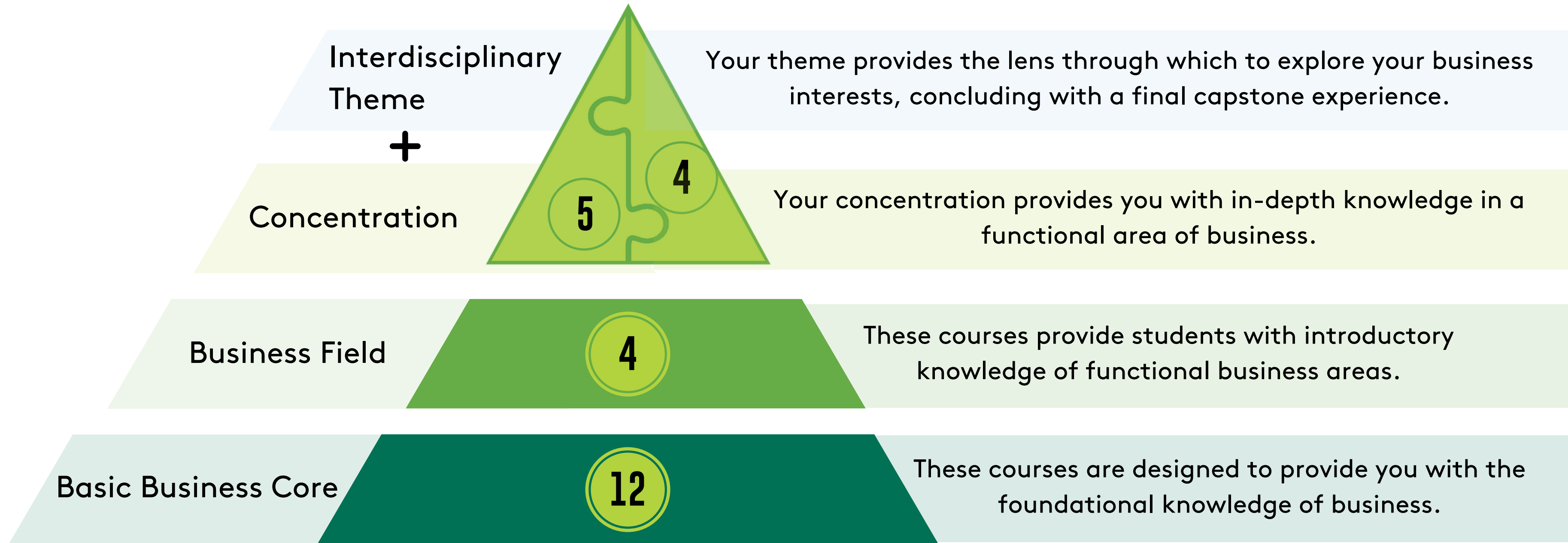

CATAMOUNT CORE CURRICULUM

CATAMOUNT CORE is made up of 42 credits in courses distributed across three main areas:

- Liberal Arts (21 credits)
- Core Skills (9 credits)
- Common Ground Values (12 credits)

Students will be able to take courses that fulfill more than one category, but they must still take at least 40 unique credits of courses that have been approved to fulfill CATAMOUNT CORE CURRICULUM requirements.

Math Placement Assessment

- All students who wish to take Fundamentals of Calculus 1 (MATH 019 or MATH 1212) or Calculus 1 (MATH 021 or MATH 1234) must take the assessment *even if you come in with AP credit.*
- All new first-year students must take the MPA **at least 48 hrs before their one-on-one advising meeting**, or risk being dropped from MATH 1212
- The MPA is on your New Student Checklist and the info has been sent to your UVM email

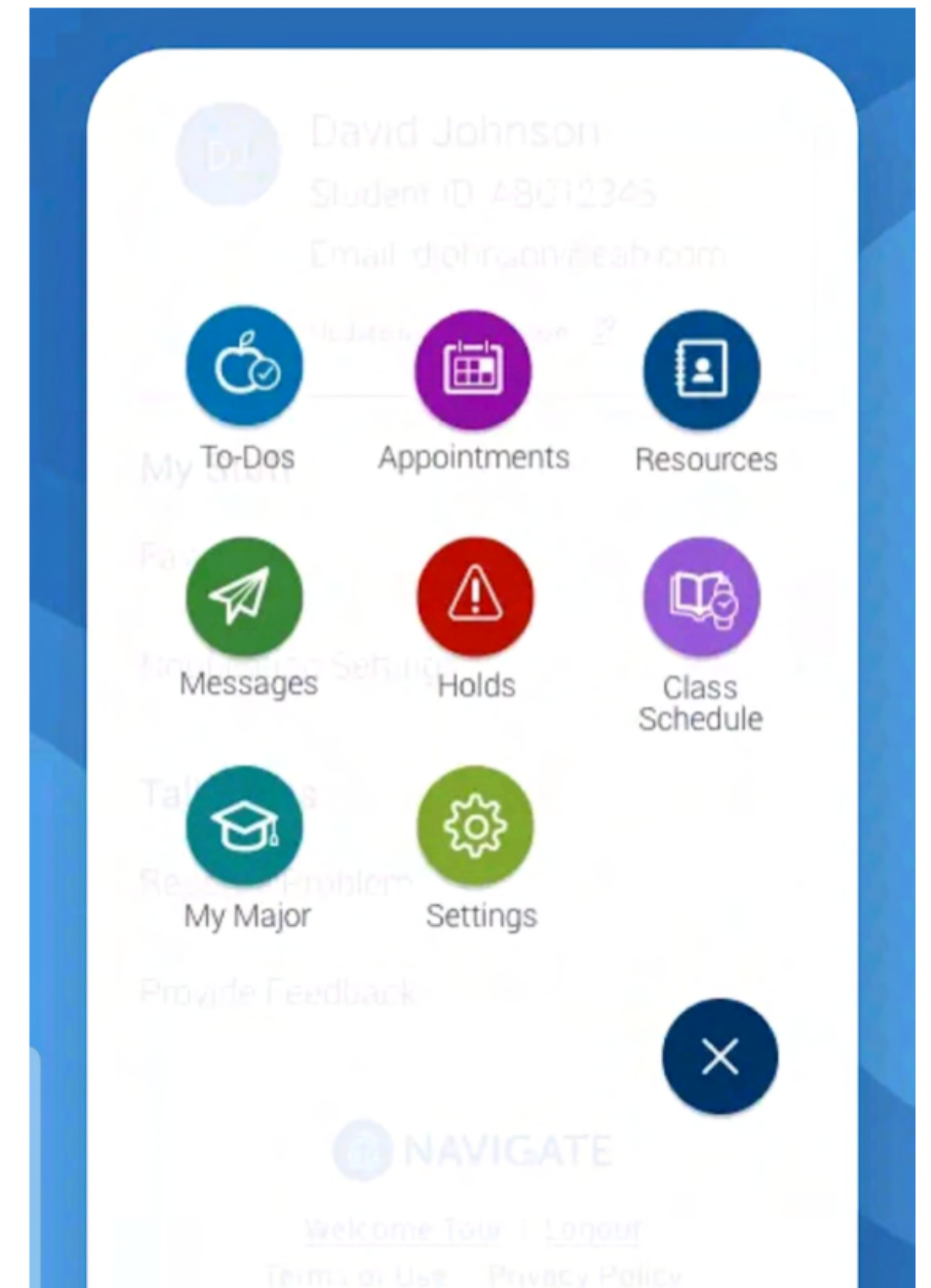
