# **Applied Lesson Syllabus**

The Music Program has established the following policies and procedures for all applied lessons (MUL 1200, 1300, 1500, 1600, 1700, 2400, 2500, 4500). In some cases, individual instructors will provide additional information that applies to their studio.

#### **Course Credit**

Applied lessons are available for one or two credit hours. Each student receives one private lesson per week for 14 weeks. Students enrolled for one credit receive half-hour weekly lessons, while students enrolled for two credits receive one-hour weekly lessons. Non-majors may be required to take a placement audition before they are accepted for study; this audition may be formal or informal at the discretion of the teacher. Music Majors are required to pass an Entrance Audition or Basic Performance Assessment before they are accepted for study in MU 2500, and an Intermediate Performance Assessment before acceptance for study in MU 4500.

### **Scheduling**

Applied lessons are scheduled at the mutual convenience of the teacher and student. Please note, however, that some faculty come to campus only one or two days per week. Students should contact their teachers during the first week of the semester for schedule details.

#### Attendance

Attendance at all lessons is a course requirement. If a faculty member must cancel a lesson, they will inform the student by e-mail or by a sign posted on the lesson studio door. Students should then contact the faculty member to schedule a make-up lesson.

If a student must cancel a lesson, they must inform the faculty member by e-mail or voice mail prior to the lesson time. When possible, faculty will make up a lesson canceled prior to the lesson time. No make-up lesson will be scheduled when the student does not contact the faculty member prior to the lesson time. Further, faculty will not be expected to make up more than two lessons canceled by the student.

#### **Practice**

Expectations will vary from teacher to teacher, but students should expect to practice a minimum of 3 hours per week.

#### **Applied Lesson Register**

At the final lesson of each semester, the student will submit an Applied Lesson Register to their teacher, listing repertoire studied during the semester. No grade will be given until the Applied Lesson Register has been completed.

#### **Jury Performances**

End-of-semester jury policies vary by area. Please consult your teacher or Area Head with questions.

#### **Student Performance Recitals**

A music major enrolled in applied lessons in their principal instrument must perform on at least two student recitals prior to being eligible for an Intermediate Performance Assessment, and another two recitals prior to being eligible for a Recital Audition and Senior Recital.

#### **Grading**

Grading policies vary from teacher to teacher, and will generally be based on attendance, progress, and practice time.

#### Accompaniment

Students are responsible for compensating accompanists unless the performance is required for the music major. The Music Program will compensate accompanists for required performances up to a certain maximum. See the office for details.
