









## **Curriculum Overview**







## CATAMOUNT CORE CURRICULUM

**CATAMOUNT CORE** is made up of 42 credits in courses distributed across three main areas:

- Liberal Arts (21 credits)
- Core Skills (9 credits)
- Common Ground Values (12 credits)

Students will be able to take courses that fulfill more than one category, but they must still take at least 40 unique credits of courses that have been approved to fulfill CATAMOUNT CORE CURRICULUM requirements.



# **Registration Advising**

- Schedule your course registration appointment!
  - An email was sent to your UVM email asking you to sign up for a Course Registration Group Advising session please do that ASAP!
- Your Fall Schedule
  - You have already been enrolled in courses for the Fall this schedule is based on course requirements for your major program and is a **draft** that can be finalized and/or adjusted during your advising meeting or later this summer.
  - All Rubenstein Students take core curriculum courses in their first semester:
    - NR 1010: Natural History & Human Ecology 1 (4-credit lab-based course)
    - NR 1050: Critical Reflection & Dialogue (1-credit discussion-based course)



# Registration Advising

- Important Notes:
  - Most classes are MWF or TR
  - Credit hours typically equal the amount of time spent in class per week (ex. 3 credits = 3 hours of class; 1 credit = 1 hour of class, etc.)
    - This does NOT include study/homework hours...you'll need to determine what works best for you for time management!
  - 20 minutes are built in between classes, which is typically plenty of time to walk to your next class (even if it's across campus!)
  - Full time student status is anywhere between 12-19 credits. Our recommendation is to fall between 14-16 credits if possible.
    - 120 credits are required to graduate, which averages 15 credits per semester to graduate in 8 semesters/4 years
