General Guidelines for M.S. & PhD Committees:

- Your Studies Committee and Thesis/Project/Dissertation Defense Committee do not need to be identical, but will follow the same guidelines for membership
 - Studies Committee members should be communicated to
 <u>RSENR Grad Coord@uvm.edu</u> via the appropriate <u>Program of Study form</u> (<u>M.S.</u>
 or <u>PhD</u>), by the end of our second semester of study.
 - Defense Committee members should be communicated to <u>gradcoll@uvm.edu</u> via this <u>Defense Committee Membership form</u>, at the beginning of the semester you intend to defend.
- Adding Additional Committee Members: Once the minimum membership guidelines have been met (outlined below), you may add additional committee members, as desired
 - Additional committee members that are non-UVM members or non-graduate college graduate faculty members, must be approved via your advisor(s) emailing gradcoll@uvm.edu with this request and the member's CV
 - Please note, additional members may make scheduling committee meetings more challenging!

M.S. Committee Membership Guidelines:

- ❖ Your advisor must be from inside the Rubenstein School *and* a member of the Graduate College Graduate Faculty
- The Chair must be from outside the Rubenstein School and a member of the Graduate College Graduate Faculty
- One additional member must be from the University of Vermont faculty
