



Results of the Survey on Qualified Facilities

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Summary of Results

The survey reached more than 600 individuals and received 67 responses.

- 71.6% responded that they are interested in learning more about qualified facilities and the qualified facility attestation form.
- Webinars (68.3%) and white papers via email (66.7%) are the type of training session/material favored the most
- More than 70% of the respondents find a need for food safety training for small and very small facilities
- 50 individuals responded that their facilities are small food facilities, but only 30 (60%) responded that their facilities are registered.
- 78% (of 50 responses) are interested in knowing more about qualified facilities and how to complete a qualified facility attestation form.
- Food safety topics where more information is needed include:
 - Cleaning and sanitation: prevention of cross contamination,
 - Dairy regulations and example of dairy food safety plans
 - Good manufacturing practices
 - Labels
 - Microbial testing: environmental monitoring testing, product testing. testing for pathogens, testing for shelf life, interpretation of lab reports
 - Preventive controls: identified hazards, interventions to address contaminations
 - Recall and recall management
 - Record keeping
 - Regulatory compliance
 - Traceability

Future activities organized by UVM Extension in support of small food facilities
