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




#### Range-data systems for Archaeological Survey



Laser scanner system

Range-data systems are currently able to register a lot of data describing accurately the world around us.

In order to study and analyze the cryptoprticus preserved near Mompeo, the research group decided to use a phase difference laser scanner FARO 120. More than 50 scans were carried out to have a complete numerical model of the monument.

By setting the acquisition in reflectance mode, the resolution of the data is very high and allows to analyze the whole surfaces of the inner walls.

In the processing step some algorithms were applied for reducing the noises of the laser beam and to enhance the information for the meshing reconstruction.

This part of the process was realized with different software able to make interpolations without altering the position of the points in space.

The mesh process was necessary to reduce the weight of data and to complete shadow parts not covered with the laser.

The preliminary results show important information about the distribution of the corridors and their lying.




Fig.1/ The image shows the main plan surveyed and a section of the cryptoprticus. The representation suggests different phases in the life of the monument and further areas that must be excavated.



Fig.2/ Cross section from a perspective view of the main area of the cryptoporticus. The point cloud was transformed in a surface model through the meshing process.




Fig.3/ Different view of the monument. The numerical model was composed by 80 million of points. During the elaboration phase the noises were reduced and different algorithms were applied to enabled the information of the raw files.



## Gnaeus Pompeius Magnus (106-48 BCE)



### Fundus/mons Pompeianus, Pompega & Mompeo

### Gregory of Catino (1060-1130), Regesto di Farfa, Documenti 224 (817 CE), 282 (840 CE) and 300 (857? - 859? CE):

"....Fundum acutianum, ubi ipsum venerabile monasterium constructum est, cum finibus et appendicibus suis in integrum. Fundum calistrianum, in quo est aecclesia sancti laurentii. Fundum pompeianum..."

### Regesto di Farfa, Vol. III (pp. 128 – 129), Documento 419 (1003 CE):
