Article 14.5.f.ii - All departmental/unit faculty may read and comment on the dossier. However, in all tenure or promotion/tenure cases, only department tenured faculty may vote on such recommendations.

In all other promotion cases - whether tenure-track or non-tenure-track - only those department faculty who hold the same or higher rank than that being sought by the candidate may vote on the promotion recommendation, however, a department may allow Associate Professors to vote on promotion to Professor if indicated in its RPT guidelines and procedures. Whether tenure-track or not, Professors may vote on any such case; Associate Professors may vote on promotion to Associate Professor or Senior Lecturer; and Assistant Professors and Senior Lecturers may vote on promotion to Senior Lecturers.
