## MANAGEMENT STATIONS:

**Station 1** - Breeding stallions and horses in training.

**Station 2** - Weanlings, yearlings, dry broodmares

**Station 3** - Broodmare & foal management

## Academic Internship

Through the University of Vermont College of Agriculture and Life Sciences, the internship offers academic credit for a 6 month term, (spring or fall semester).

The spring semester focuses on equine reproduction, while the fall semester focuses more on training young horses.

Interns live on the farm & are paid a small stipend. Utilities & wifi included with on-farm housing.

## Apprenticeship

Apprentices live on the farm for a year term, consisting of about four months at each of the three management stations of the 40-60 horse herd of UVM Morgans.

On the job training methods offer a practical approach invaluable to the acquisition of skills in animal husbandry.

Apprentices are paid a small living stipend, utilities & wifi included with on-farm housing.
