THE AGRITOURISM ACT

The Accelerating the Growth of Rural Innovation and Tourism Opportunities to Uphold Rural Industries and Sustainable Marketplaces (AGRITOURISM)

Act was introduced by Rep. Jennifer Wexton (D-VA) and Rep. Dan

Newhouse (R-WA) to support agritourism businesses across the country by:

- Creating an Office of Agritourism at USDA to consolidate federal resources available to agritourism businesses
- Serving as dedicated voice for agritourism within the federal government
 - Promoting and encouraging agritourism activities by coordinating partnerships and providing mentorship opportunities
