ANTHROPOLOGY MAJOR CONCENTRATION IN GLOBAL HEALTH, COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES (B.A.), UNIVERSITY OF VERMONT

Students interested in human health and its variation within and across different populations, cultures, and societies can tailor their major in Anthropology to focus on Global Health. The department offers a variety of courses centered on biological and cultural anthropology and related to the body and health in varying cultural, social, and environmental settings. To sign up, declare an Anthropology minor on the Registrar's page, and contact the Anthropology Department to be assigned an appropriate advisor.

While fulfilling all requirements for the general Anthropology major*, Anthropology of Global Health concentrators must take at least twelve credits from the following course list (comprising 12 credits out of the total of 34 credits required for the major), with at least six of these credits at the 100-level or above and at least three of these course credits at the 200-level:

Beyond the above list, the following courses may be considered for concentration approval:

- Special or variable topics courses or internships as approved by the concentration advisor.
- ANTH 179: D2: Environmental Anthropology or ANTH 220: Development & Applied Anthropology with relevant project if approved by the concentration advisor.
- Additional courses with relevant project may count if approved by the concentration advisor.

Students who began this Major Concentration earlier may follow the requirements of that time.

* All requirements for the Anthropology major must also be fulfilled, as follows**:

- All four of the following courses ANTH 021, 024, 026, and 028 (12 credits)
 - Note: ANTH 026 counts toward the concentration.
- Two 100-level courses (6 credits) in two different subfields (see Anthropology list of courses by subfield)
 Note: For concentrators, this typically includes two 100-level courses from concentration list above.
- At least two courses (6 credits) at the 200-level:
 - Only three credits of ANTH 200 can count, and ANTH 293 will not count, toward this requirement.
 - Note: For concentrators, this typically includes a 200-level course from concentration list above.
 - IF ANTH 293 was used toward the concentration requirement, a third 200-level course is needed.

• Two additional courses at the 100- or 200-level (6 credits) <u>AND</u> One additional course at any level (3 credits).

- These can, but do not need to be, drawn from the concentration course list above.
 Either ANTH 105 (1 credit) or ANTH 205 (1 credit) are required; taking both is highly recommended.
