ANTHROPOLOGY MINOR: GLOBAL HEALTH FOCUS TRACK **COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES, UNIVERSITY OF VERMONT**

Students interested in human health and its variation within and across populations, cultures, and societies can focus on those issues through the Global Health Track in the Anthropology Minor. The Anthropology department offers a variety of courses centered on biological and cultural anthropology that are related to the body and health in varying cultural, social, and environmental settings. To sign up, declare an Anthropology minor on the Registrar's webpage, and contact the Anthropology Department to be assigned to an appropriate advisor.

In fulfilling the requirements for the Anthropology Minor (18 credits total)*, students on the Global Health Focus track take ANTH 021 and ANTH 026 as their required core courses (6 credits), two track-specific courses at the 100-level or above (6 credits), one additional track-specific course at any level (3 credits), and one additional Anthropology course at the 100-level or above (3 credits).
