Course Summary:

NFS 196 Internship Practicum is an opportunity for students to gain professional experience in an area of nutrition and food science that interests them. Students gain the skills to learn, problem solve, think critically and work independently in a real -life work environment under the mentorship of a community supervisor. This course offers the opportunity to learn and demonstrate professionalism.

Course Requirements:

Community experience 45 hours/credit	85 pts
PPT presentation & self-evaluation	10 pts
Professionalism	<u>5 pts</u>

Course Expectations

- Students will develop an agreed upon contract stating goals, objectives and time commitments with their community supervisor.
- Students will work 45 hours per credit under the direction of a community supervisor.
- Students will create and end of semester PPT presentation and self-evaluation.
- Students will demonstrate professional behavior both at the worksite and with the course instructor. All required paperwork (contract, timesheet, supervisor evaluation, PPT and self-evaluation) will be completed in a timely manner.
