

Nutrient Management Planning (NMP) Course Information

The Nutrient Management Course was designed to help farmers balance nutrients on fields and meet state and federal reporting standards. Participants in this course will finish with a completed nutrient management plan (NMP) that meets the NRCS 590 Standard. Farmers have been able to cut costs by reducing unnecessary fertilizer applications and increase yields with more effective distribution of manure applications.

NMPs are created in this course using **goCrop™**, an online tool available on the web and as a mobile app. You can download it for a free 30-day trial here: www.gocrop.com. goCrop™ will help you store your data, manage your plan, and keep records. The mobile app helps you keep records in the field so that your plan stays up-to-date.

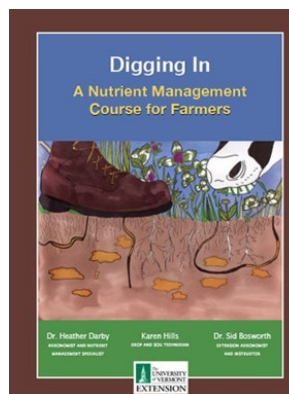
Basic Course Requirements:

- Current soil analysis for all fields on the farm
- Current manure analysis
- Field maps including soil, nitrate leaching, topographic, etc.
- RUSLE2 Values
