

Lecturer Position at the University of Vermont in the Department of Animal & Veterinary Sciences.

The Department of Animal & Veterinary Sciences at the University of Vermont invites applications for a Full-time Lecturer Position to begin August 2020. This is a 12-month (0.8 FTE) teaching position.

Responsibilities include teaching our experiential learning program, CREAM (Cooperative for Real Education in Agricultural Management), as well as other undergraduate courses in the department such as Clinical Topics in Livestock Medicine, Lactation Physiology, and Parasitology. Advising and mentoring undergraduate students, and service contributions to the Department and University are also expected.

CREAM has become one of our most popular programs since its inception in 1988. It places emphasis on experiential learning to develop interpersonal, teamwork, and practical problem-solving skills. For this course, 15-20 undergraduate students manage and care for the University's herd of registered Holstein dairy cattle through enrollment in either a 2 semester course (spring and fall semesters) or our summer course offering.

Qualified applicants must possess a M.S. or Ph.D. (preferred) in Animal Science, or Dairy Science or a closely related field, or a DVM with dairy experience. Knowledge of dairy science, production and management, and experience in the dairy industry are essential.

The University is especially interested in candidates who can contribute to the diversity and excellence of the academic community through quality teaching, undergraduate advising, and service contributions. Applicants are requested to include in their cover letter information about how they will further the University's goal of fostering diversity and inclusiveness on campus.
