Summer Program Media Educator 450 hours position June 11th to August 17th 2018

University of Vermont, Upward Bound

This AmeriCorps position will serve as part of CEDO's EACH Youth AmeriCorps program. Our members will receive training and provide direct service in support of program goals to close opportunity gaps through: expanding culturally appropriate youth programming and family supports, supporting school engagement for youth to graduate ready for postsecondary and career opportunities, and keeping youth safe and motivated to pursue their academic and personal interests. Our members will provide innovative responses to pressing community problems through collaboration with city departments, state agencies, other educational institutions and nonprofit organizations in Burlington, Winooski, and elsewhere in Chittenden County. At the end of the program year, AmeriCorps members will be responsible for increasing student engagement within their schools and communities and for helping provide access to employment and internship opportunities, academic coaching, and other enrichment experiences for youth.

Organization Mission:

The University of Vermont TRIO Upward Bound Program is a program for low-income students who would be the first generation in their family to obtain a college degree. Our mission is to expose participants to various enrichment opportunities and to support them in developing necessary skills for completing high school, then enrolling in and graduating from college.

Goal of Position & Service Projects:

The AmeriCorps Summer Program Activities Coordinator will begin June 11th 2018 and serve through mid - August. From June 18–July 27, 2018 we offer a six-week, non-residential summer program (referred to as Summer College) on the UVM campus for up to 50 high school students from Burlington and Winooski High Schools.

Key Responsibilities:

The Media Educator will serve with Upward Bound participants throughout the summer in order to assist youth in telling their own stories through a variety of media, teach them about the power of digital storytelling, and encourage responsible and appropriate technology use. The Media Educator will help create content geared specifically towards first-generation and low-income youth who are either enrolled in Upward Bound or may be eligible for the program.



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The Media Educator will be the person primarily responsible for updating the Summer Program Facebook/Instagram page, with a principal focus on involving students in the creation of content. He/she will also be responsible for participating in and filming program workshops, field trips, events, and services including community service projects, career exploratory events, leadership development activities and recreational opportunities.

This content will be used to create a student-led "end of summer" video to be presented at the Final Showcase. He/she will also create a media workshop for students to learn how to develop their stories through film/social media and how to present themselves in a positive way online. This position will also support efforts to educate community partners about our program and the services we provide.

The Media Educator will provide direct support to low-income and underrepresented high school students during the six-week summer program. Leadership Trip (June 18-22), a trip with 40-50 program participants to a location TBD (potentially Boston or Philadelphia) to explore area colleges, visit local museums, and take in other unique cultural experiences.

The AmeriCorps Media Educator will: maintain accurate quarterly reporting information as requested by CEDO's EACH Youth AmeriCorps program and comply with Upward Bound reporting policies; submit biweekly AmeriCorps timesheets via OnCorps, and participate in orientations, trainings, and reflective activities hosted by CEDO's EACH Youth AmeriCorps program.

Secondary Responsibilities:

- Collaborating with other summer members and program staff to create engaging programming
- Helping with tracking program activity attendance
- Supporting the implementation of the USDA Summer Food Service Program

Skills and Qualifications:

Enrolled in a Bachelor degree program with minimum third year credits status preferred. The successful candidate has demonstrated a commitment to addressing diversity concerns as well as sensitivity to individuals who have limited income and/or are from educationally disadvantaged backgrounds. Training and/or experience in filming, editing, and designing videos are essential. Experience working with youth and knowledge of adolescent issues and needs is desirable. Valid driver's license and clean driving record are required.

Minimum Qualifications:


• US citizen or have permanent resident status

• At least 18 years of age upon entering the Pre-Service Orientation (no upper age limit), or 17 years of age with written parental permission;

• High school graduate or have a GED certificate, or be willing to work towards GED as part of serviceyear successful completion requirement.

• Has not been convicted of murder or required to be on a sex offender registry, and is willing to undergo a National Service Criminal History Check

• Commitment to the goals of the CEDO's EACH Youth AmeriCorps program



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Additional Information:

The position will primarily be performed with high school students at the University of Vermont as well as in the Burlington/Winooski communities. The position will also require irregular and late-night hours both during the Leadership Trip and during our college visits/overnight trips each Thursday night.

Positions to begin June 11th, 2018 and end August 17th, 2018.

This position is:

X Quarter Time: Requires 450 hours of service. Member will receive a living allowance of \$3,703 (pretax), and an education award of \$1,453 (pre-tax) upon successful completion of service. Other benefits include federal school loan forbearance, and various training opportunities. This position also has the option of UVM housing.
