Defining Community Data

- Broad Definition
 - demographics, economics, transportation...
- At the municipal level (town / village)
 - with comparison to other muni's, county, state, nation
- Normally collected by state or fed. agency
 - if not, self-collection is necessary





Uses for Community Data

- Planning
 - land use, budgeting, services, facilities, etc.
- Writing Grants
- Community Development
 - Including Economic Development
- Assisting Residents





Finding Community Data

- Sources throughout state and fed. gov't
 - Census Bureau, VT Labor, VT Taxes, etc.

- Emphasis on online dissemination
 - fewer, if any, hard copy pubs
 - but library or direct contact may get you some

ACS: The Sample

- Census 2000 Long Form:
 - At least 1 in 6 households in VT towns (17%)
 - some as much as 1 in 2
- American Community Survey:
 - At best, 1 in 10 households in most VT towns
 - The sample is "built up" as multi-year estimates
 - 7,802 completed household interviews in 2008 in VT
 - 3% of households, at best





ACS: Multi-Year Estimates


- Census 2000 and previous:
 - Point in time data
 - a snapshot of April 1
- ACS:
 - Averages for any 12 months within the period
 - Not independent of each other

Example of 5-year average graph





Percentage of Omaha Population with Hispanic/Latino Origin






Percentage of Omaha Population with Hispanic/Latino Origin

ACS: Residence Rule

- What determines WHERE the Census counts you and your household
 - Decennial Census: "most of the time"
 - Considered to be a 6+ month residency rule
 - ACS: >2 month residency rule
- So...
 - Decennial Census counts primary residents
 - ACS likely will mix seasonal and primary
