InfoEd Proposal Development Implementation Update

Pre-Award Services has completed the first three phases of its implementation of the InfoEd Proposal Development (PD) system. We are now developing and submitting electronic proposals to the National Institutes of Health (NIH).

In the coming months we will expand the use of InfoEd PD for all proposals to all sponsors. The configuration and testing of the PD system for proposals to all sponsors is underway. After testing, we will conduct a pilot test in a small group of departments. Then we will begin deployment across all UVM colleges and schools with an anticipated completion date of July, 2008.

InfoEd Proposal Development System <u>Implementation Status</u>

Phase I Configuration and Testing completed

Phase II NIH proposal - pilot completed
Phase III NIH proposal - deployment completed

Phase IV All sponsors pilot and deployment underway

Phase V All sponsors deployment - 2008

The deployment of InfoEd PD for all proposals will move UVM closer to our goal of electronic research administration. Key features include:

Electronic Proposal Record: Principal Investigators will continue to create their proposals on paper or in electronic systems in accordance with the usual sponsor guidelines and formats. But the completed proposal document will be uploaded into the PD system, establishing an electronic record which will be easily accessible to the PI, the Department Business Manager, the Department Chair and the Dean.

Budget Tool: Proposal budgets will be developed in the PD Budget Tool, a very robust and intuitive system that calculates salary, fringe benefits and efforts using employee salary and appointment data within the system. Detailed budget data will be easily accessible in the proposal record. ...continued on Page Two

Successful Launch of PD for NIH Proposals

UVM is now routinely using InfoEd Proposal Development (PD) system for creation and submission of its electronic National Institute of Health (NIH) grant proposals. Since the initial pilot in February and the full deployment in June, eighty-six investigators from COM, CEMS, A&S and CNHS have created more than 100 NIH proposals using InfoEd PD. The PD system, is relatively easy and intuitive to use and has become a preferred alternative to the Grants.gov proposal application packet. Here is what some users have said about InfoEd.

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Electronic Routing: PD will be used to electronically route proposals to Department Chairs and Deans for approvals. With this step, we can "retire" the Routing Form. Electronic signatures will be captured in the proposal.

Ongoing Data Capture: The proposal record will be updated as new information is received with new information available for immediate access. The award document, sponsor correspondence, subcontract agreements and much more will be uploaded to the electronic record, eliminating the need to copy and send documents to the multiple interested parties.

GCAS Access: We will be able to easily share the electronic proposal record data with the Grant and Contract Administrative Services staff, facilitating the flow of data needed in the accounting system.



Beverly Blakeney on InfoEd Proposal Development System

The InfoEd Enterprise System is fast becoming an important administrative tool for investigators and department administrators involved in research administration at UVM.

This year more than 260 users from across campus logged in to InfoEd to perform SPIN searches, create SMARTS alerts, update their User Profiles, create electronic proposals or report on proposal data. We expect the number of users will grow as we expand the use of InfoEd at UVM.

The next phase of the project involves testing and deployment of Proposal Development (PD) for ALL grant proposal submissions (not just the National Institutes of Health). Soon we will be able to electronically route proposals for approvals, a vast improvement on our current "sneaker-net" process.

Parallel with the Pre-Award Services implementation, the Research Protections Office continues to work behind the scenes to implement the InfoEd compliance modules. Look for more information about the compliance modules in the coming months.

We look forward to working with you on the next implementation phases.

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News from OSP's Research **Protections Office (RPO)**

RPO Committees and InfoEd Proposal Numbers....or the challenge of matching grants to protocols!

Funding agencies generally require the appropriate RPO review committee to review the specific research procedures outlined in a grant application. Each protocol submitted to the RPO for review, therefore, must be linked to the corresponding grant application. This is a requirement for all of the RPO Committees (the IRBs, IACUC and IBC).

This also means that a new protocol must be submitted for Committee review and approval for every new funding proposal and every competitive renewal submission.

Pre-Award Services must have assurance from the applicable committee that the protocol corresponding to the specific grant application has received the appropriate clearances from RPO when accepting your grant award. The task of matching grants to protocols over the years has been extremely difficult because it was done manually and, unfortunately, the process has been less than perfect.

Now, with the implementation of InfoEd, the electronic proposal and protocol management system, we are able to link the protocol to the grant electronically and both PAS and RPO will have access to the corresponding materials.

However, in order to link correctly we need vour assistance.

Each of our Committees has revised their protocol forms to include a field for the InfoEd Proposal Number. We have been piloting this field on the Biosafety Committee forms for six months and have found that most protocols have inaccurate or incomplete information. Problems typically include a proposal number for a proposal in which the project period has ended or for a project that was never funded.

We wanted to take this opportunity to remind you of this requirement and to assist you in becoming familiar with

this very important number. Below is a copy of the grant routing form with the InfoEd Proposal ID Number circled. This is the required number for all initial and continuing review forms.

If there is any uncertainty, please contact a staff member from either PAS or the RPO to assist you in determining the appropriate InfoEd proposal number. This will make the entire process much smoother for everyone and prevent delays in your protocol review.



NIH's Transition to Electronic Proposal Submissions

The National Institutes of Health (NIH) continues to move forward in transitioning from paper submission of grant applications to electronic submission via Grants.gov or System-to-System providers like InfoEd.

Many of the NIH mechanisms have now transitioned to electronic submissions, with only the larger and more complicated proposal mechanisms transition ON HOLD.

Remember that UVM now requires we prepare all eligible NIH electronic proposals in the InfoEd Proposal Development (PD) system.

In order to meet the needs of faculty, ensure accurate electronic submissions, and manage our workload, we will continue to seek your cooperation with the submission deadlines outlined below.

Grants.gov electronic applications

Draft is due to PAS two (2) weeks before agency deadline Final is due to PAS (1) week before agency deadline

InfoEd System-to-System electronic NIH applications

Draft is due to PAS two (2) weeks before agency deadline Final is due to PAS (1) week before agency deadline

All Other Proposals

Final is due to PAS three (3) days before agency deadline

Federal grant-making agencies will now have the option to post opportunities using Adobe forms rather than the IBM Workplace Forms currently being used. Please be sure to download the Adobe 7.0.9 Reader at http://www.grants.gov/resources/download_software.jsp#adobe prior to downloading your application package.

Please note that Grants.gov will continue to receive and process application packages using the IBM Workplace Forms until the remaining Adobe forms are made available in September 2007.
