Lessons Learned from 5 years of Routine High Tunnel Scouting for Insect Pests & Natural Enemies

Pest management in high tunnels is challenging, but achievable!

Start clean to stay clean

 Avoid planting infested plants or planting next to already infested plants, fallow between seasons, weed

Timing is EVERYTHING - Find & tackle the problem EARLY!

- Monitor pests & natural enemies (& train employees what to look for)
- Answer critical questions like: How many plants are infested? What level of pests are on each plant? Can biocontrol handle the problem?
- Follow release recommendations &/or pesticide labels
- Keep records (What did I do when & how did it work?)

Network

- Work with an Extension Agent or Biocontrol Supplier to develop action thresholds & a management plan within your budget
- Talk with other growers

Be adaptable & patient. It takes time & effort to develop a strategy that works for YOU

Provide habitat plants (like alyssum) to provide food & shelter to attract & sustain naturally occurring &/or released natural enemies.
