- 1. Assess the Causal-Historical Theory of Reference: State both the Causal-Historical Theory of Reference and the 'Madagascar' objection as clearly and carefully as you can. Explain whether and how the Causal-Historical Theory of Reference can be adequately defended against the objection.
- 2. Scientific Essentialism: Explain how Kripke uses his views concerning the semantics of natural kind terms to defend scientific essentialism. Assess whether Kripke's defense succeeds.
- 3. **The Illusion of Contingency**: Say why, despite Kripke's contention that
 - (1) Hesperus = Phosphorus is necessarily true, it nevertheless seems contingent. Explain Kripke's response to this problem. Assess whether Kripke's response succeeds.
