Food Safety Modernization Act (FSMA) Produce Safety Rule

- 1. One of 7 final FSMA Rules
- 2. Effective as of January 26, 2016
- 3. Sets national standards for <u>farms</u> that grow, harvest, pack, or hold <u>produce</u>
- 4. Tiered compliance dates based on annual sales
- 5. Several types of exemptions

Key Requirements Covered Farms

Conditions and practices that may contribute to microbial contamination of produce

Worker health, hygiene & training

Equipment, tools, buildings & sanitation

Domesticated & wild animals

Agricultural water

Pre-harvest

Handwashing; Food contact

Biological soil amendments of animal origin (BSAAO)

Raw manure

Stabilized compost

What does the Agency of Agriculture (already) do?

- 1. Conduct USDA Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) audits
- 2. Work with VVBGA and UVM Extension on CAPS development and conduct CAPS+ audits
- 3. Offer grants: Specialty Crop Block Grant Program, Local Food Market Development, Working Lands
- 4. Regulate apples, potatoes & strawberries (retail & farmers market inspections)
- 5. Regulate on-farm pesticide use and provide applicator training

Produce Program Development

- 1. Offer technical assistance focused on helping growers understand the FSMA Produce Safety Rule
- 2. Host Produce Safety Alliance (PSA) Grower Trainings
- 3. Conduct On-Farm Readiness Reviews
- 4. Offer Vermont Produce Safety Improvement Grants
- 5. Conduct inspections beginning in 2019

Compliance Dates for Covered Farms

Business Size	Compliance Dates
"All Other Businesses" >\$500K average annual produce sales	January 26, 2018
Small Businesses	January 28, 2019
Very Small Businesses	January 27, 2020
Qualified Exempt Farms – Retention of Records	January 26, 2016
Qualified Exempt Farms – Labeling	January 1, 2020

What should you do now?

- Enroll in the Vermont Produce Portal www.agriculture.Vermont/ProduceProgram
 - → Receive produce safety and produce safety rule resources
 - → Understand if your farm is subject to the Produce Safety Rule through the assistance of a Produce Program staff member
 - → Gain eligibility for a Vermont Produce Safety Improvement Grant
 - → Request an On-Farm Readiness Review (OFRR)
