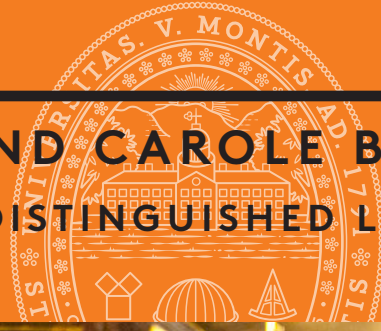

# BEHAVIORAL INSIGHTS FOR THE DESIGN OF ENVIRONMENTAL POLICIES: FROM MICRO-DECISIONS TO LARGE-SCALE COLLECTIVE-ACTION PROBLEMS

Each day, individuals, households, and organizations make small choices and take small actions that, as a whole, have enormous impacts on the Earth's resource base. Changing our development path requires changes in human behavior, market incentives, social norms, and habits. We need well-designed policies that are based on a good understanding of the motivations behind human decisions.

Dr. Francisco Alpizar's work explores incentive-based approaches to generating improved private and public management and use of natural resources, with a particular focus on climate change and developing countries. He has consulted to the Global Environmental Fund, Inter-American Development Bank, International Union for Conservation of Nature, Nature Conservancy, United Nations Development Program, World Bank, and the World Wildlife Federation, among others. His work appears in a number of journals, including *Journal of Public Economics*, *Journal of Economic Behavior and Organization*, *Environmental and Resource Economics*, and *Ecological Economics*. He has served as associate editor of *World Development* and guest editor at *Environmental and Development Economics*, and is currently an international advisor to the Center for Collective Action Research at the University of Gothenburg.
