

Williamstown May 5. 1819

Dear Sir

I saw your Brother at Montpelier about
a fortnight since & promised him I would
in a few days write the enclosed letter & send
to Mr. Van Duse at Burlington who was
soon to set out for Dr. Gorton & I supposed was
now gone. Perhaps you may know where
Mr. Van Duse puts up then I wrote to
send it to him, or if you think it will
be of any use you can send it directly
to Mr. Adams - Your Brother however told
me that Mr. Van Duse had the charge
of the business -

I have the letter open for you to seal
Upon my return from Montpelier after
seeing your Brother I became quite unwell
& my promise entirely forgot my mother
told me till Monday last -
